NIB cycles through Charlestown Bypass opening

NIB Health Funds will set the first sets of wheels in motion along the new West Charlestown Bypass at the roadway's official opening on Sunday, 2 March.

More than 150 cyclists, including international competitors, will be entering the NIB Cycle Classic which starts at 7.30am.
